

Art Across Campus

It would surprise many to hear that Glacier Hills houses one of the finest, most complete collections of work by local southeast Michigan artists that exists. This is in large part due to a series of art fairs held at Glacier Hills, inviting local artists to bring a selection of works to be voted on by residents and purchased with donated funds.

The Foundation-funded **Huron Room Gallery** on the third floor of the Meadows allows for this collection to be explored and celebrated in a new light. Pieces from the farthest reaches of campus can be grouped together in one place, giving them a fresh audience and deepened appreciation. The current exhibition, titled *Fine Print: Original Art Prints from the Glacier Hills Collection*, opened on January 3 with a reception and continues to be available for viewing through **March 6** (feel free to turn on the lights, located to the right of the doors – the switches are lightly obscured by drapery).

In the meantime, preparation has already begun for the next exhibition. This show will feature works created by residents of Glacier Hills and will be juried by a panel of professionals from the Ann Arbor art community. **Submissions are currently open, and any current residents of Glacier Hills are encouraged to put forward pieces of art of any medium.** Entry forms can be found in the Glacier Hills Foundation office (across from the mailboxes in the Manor). This exhibition will be on view from **March 13 – May 8, 2020**.
