# **Art Across Campus**

It is well known that there is a lively interest in art at Glacier Hills. Something that may be less apparent is what exactly goes into caring for and celebrating a collection of fine art like the one housed on campus. As the Art Coordinator at Glacier Hills, my primary function is to manage this collection and properly showcase it to residents, colleagues, and visitors.

This work involves developing a **comprehensive inventory** of the art on campus, and then thoroughly researching each piece to discover its history. It also involves care and maintenance, ensuring it is preserved and displayed in a way that will keep it in top condition for years to come. I, along with the **Art Across Campus Committee**, manage the process for acquiring new works into the collection, and deciding when a piece is no longer of merit and needs to find a new home.

Note that not every piece of art on campus is considered a part of the **Glacier Hills Collection**. My work is focused around art that provides particular merit to Glacier Hills, whether via its personal connection to the community, or its significance within the art world.

Thanks to the generosity of the Glacier Hills Foundation, I have received grant funding to implement a rotating gallery space, informational wall labels, a lecture series, and acquisition of several new pieces of original art. These initiatives will do immense work in enhancing the Collection that so greatly enriches our walls.

# **Employee Support Appeal Update**

Last month in the *Buzz* we announced that the Employee Support Appeal had resulted in \$51,000 of support from 50 different donors. As if that alone wasn't GREAT, we now have \$64,335 in donations from 61 donors! This year alone, 20 employees received scholarships, totaling \$51,000. In addition, one employee who was experiencing a significant financial challenge has received support through the **Emergency Support Program**. Both of these programs are funded through your gifts. Your generosity abounds, and we are extremely grateful!

#### **Foundation Chats**

The Foundation board at its October 1 meeting adopted a set of Strategic Priorities and funding initiatives that will be our focus for the next year. The strategic priorities include reaffirming our mission and the philanthropic difference made through the Foundation, outlining and understanding the role of the Foundation board, and increasing communications around our funding initiatives. Our funding initiatives include programs that enrich the lives of our residents, programs that support our employees, and new trends and technologies that benefit our residents and continue to highlight Glacier Hills as an industry leader.

As part of our communications plan, we are beginning monthly Foundation Chats in January. These Chats will be one hour in length, hosted by board members, and will pop up all around our campus, in locations close to your apartment. Stay tuned for personal invitations as the year unfolds.
