Mostly Mozart Concert Coming in March



Mostly Mozart, a newly envisioned concert, will be held in the 3rd floor dining space in the Manor in March. We are thrilled that the concert has been exclusively sponsored by **Becky Bonnell** (Meadows resident), who shares the same excitement as **Priscilla Johnson** to

establish concerts in the dining space. "We believe the space is ideally suited for these types of concerts," says Priscilla, "so why not try it?"

The concert features the quartet **Con Fuoco** who will offer three works: Divertimento No. 1 (Mozart), Quartet in One Movement, Op. 89 (Amy Beach), and Quintet for Strings and Clarinet (Mozart). The concert will seat roughly 60 people and will take place on **Wednesday**, **March 4**, **7:15 p.m.** Watch for announcements coming out soon!

Education Program Supports Employees

A grant proposal to offer Specialized Education to employees at Glacier Hills was written and funded in 2017, with funding up to **\$45,000**. The concept was to fund employees who wished to gain specialized training and certifications that would help them in their current positions or to one they wish to aspire at Glacier Hills. It would also offer scholarships for those employees who begin college classes out of the cycle of the regular Spring/Fall scholarships.

With staff changes during 2017, the program stalled and nothing was promoted about the program. Last fall we **renewed the program** and promoted it to employees, with an overwhelming amount of interest and application. Since then, **more than a dozen** have applied for and/or received funding for specialized training and education. Some examples include:

Spring Grants Cycle Coming Up

We are happy to announce that the call for proposals for grant funding through the Foundation is upon us. Announcements are going out this week, with proposals due by **April 17, 2020**. Approved projects will be funded **July 1, 2020** and run through **June 30, 2021** for Annual Grants and 2022 for Campus Grants.

This year the grants will include **Annual Grants** funded through the General Endowment of the Foundation, as well as the second offering of **Campus Fund Grants** funded through the Campus Fund made possible by the Trinity affiliation in 2016. Requests for **Annual Grants** are typically between \$500 and \$25,000 and include funding for new or ongoing programs and projects around campus. Requests for **Campus Grants** are intended for projects and

strategies related to the future of the campus or any extensions of the same. The first cycle of Campus Grants was in 2017 for funding in FY18-20, and the grants ranged from **\$30,000 to over \$250,000**.
